

Instructional Technology Assistance Project (ITAP)

SEF's ITAP provides technology training, classroom equipment and instructional assistance to faculty members at Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs) to enhance classroom instruction through the use of technology.



SEF's program exposes a core of faculty, librarians and information technologists to state-of-the-art practices in using technology to enhance teaching and student learning. Participants master the use of technologies, learn research-based methods to enhance student achievement, and explore strategies on how technology can optimize in-class instruction and learning through exposure to a variety of software, web site development, on-line instruction and distance learning, related technology, and teacher planning and assessment.

The Project holds periodic seminars for the schools' participants and provides small grants for participants to undertake projects that can expand instructional technology across their own campuses. The program also assists some private HBCUs in Texas to improve their electronic databases by affording them access to JSTOR, an on-line subscription service that provides a large collection of full-text, scholarly journals.
